Activities in order of priority	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Collecting severe cases from the streets to hospitals. Ensuring that listed beneficiaries get proper treatment and are followed up to take the drugs as recommended. We shall arrange for doctors to come to our centre to give treatment on the spot instead of patients moving to Butabika mental hospital which they resent. Ensuring that those on recovery program are skilled and empowered to start income generating projects or some work for sustainability. Carrying out group therapy for those undergoing recovery and those already recovering. Counselling and enhancing family reunion for those who are abandoned.



Background	<p>Mental disorder refers to as a clinically proven condition that causes stress and malfunctioning of the brain causing a person to exhibit signs of frustration, anger, and disconnection from normally expected behaviours of a health person. Such cases can be severe or mild. There is a strong social bias in Uganda which associates the causes of Mental disorders to the influence of spirits, curses and witchcraft which has caused a lot of suffering and pain to the victims and family members affected.</p> <p>SEECHILD focuses on rehabilitation and skilling of the patients in collaboration with the family members. Our services have a strong bearing upon the parents or the care takers participation in ensuring that medication is regularly taken, and the patient is well looked after so that our services yield good results by; Training of Parents / guardians and selection of patients to be rehabilitated, rehabilitation of the selected patients, skilling of rehabilitated patients, resettlement of the trainees in an environment where they can apply the skills acquired for survival</p> <p>In (2018-2021) SEECHILD received a donation from Mirembe foundation to support two groups of (11 – 20) persons with mental illness. These were rehabilitated for a year and taken through vocational skilling for 2 years in order to empower them for income generating projects thus ensuring their personal sustainability.
